YEA! Environmental Programs

South Plantation's 9th grade Magnet students are taking part in three unique in-school "field trips" this year. The trips will take place either in the classroom, on school campus, or at Plantation Heritage Park.

The trips will consist of three unique individual programs-created and run by the Youth Environmental Alliance, aka: YEA! The programs this year are the following:

1. Wetland Wonders –

September 29th and
October 2nd, 2017

2. Lakeville –

January 22nd and 23rd, and January
29th and 30th, 2018

3. Fishing for Success –

February 5th through 9th, 2018
February 9th (Fishing trip day)

If any of the programs are cancelled, students will resume their regular in-class curriculum – school-wide refund policy will be enforced.

On the final day of the fishing program, all students must wear **closed-toed shoes, magnet shirt and have their school ID**. Code of conduct rules and consequences are enforced during these programs.

Wetlands

Students explore the wonders of water, the water cycle, the function and importance of wetlands and water conservation. It facilitates environmental awareness and critical thinking skills.

Lakeville

Students will become experts in Florida ecosystems, natural resource management, and civic responsibility. It ends with a fun game-show style activity that gives students a chance to use their persuasive debate skills and make management decisions about a local freshwater habitat.

Fishing

Students learn about fisheries, aquatic environments, and economics associated with fishing. Responsible angling is taught, as well as history! There is a fishing session at Plantation Heritage Park – poles and tackle included!
