## Wetlands

Students explore the wonders of water, the water cycle, the function and importance of wetlands and water conservation. The program facilitates environmentalism and critical thinking skills.

## YEA! Environmental Programs

South Plantation's 9<sup>th</sup> grade Magnet students are taking part in three unique in-school "field trips" this year. The trips will take place either in the classroom, on school campus, or at Plantation Heritage Park.

The trips will consist of three unique individual programs- created and run by the Youth Environmental Alliance, aka: YEA! The programs this year are the following:

### 1. Wetland Wonders – 1 class

October 14<sup>th</sup> (purple day)  
October 15<sup>th</sup> (gold day)

### 2. Lakeville – 2 classes

January 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> (gold days)  
January 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> (purple days)

### 3. Fishing for Success – 2 classes

February 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> (gold days)  
February 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> (purple days)

## Lakeville

Students will become experts in Florida ecosystems, natural resource management, and civic responsibility. It ends with a fun game-show style activity that gives students a chance to use their persuasive debate skills and make management decisions about a local freshwater habitat.

### 4. Fishing Field Trip Day:

February 11<sup>th</sup> (gold day)  
-morning session – periods 5 and 6  
-afternoon session – periods 7 and 8

If any of the programs are cancelled, students will resume their regular in-class curriculum and school-wide refund policy will be enforced (or rescheduled date).

On the final day of the fishing program, all students must wear **closed-toed shoes, magnet shirt and have their school ID**. Code of conduct rules and consequences are enforced during these programs.



## Fishing

Students learn about fisheries, aquatic environments, and economics associated with fishing. Responsible angling is taught, as well as history! There is a fishing session at Plantation Heritage Park – poles and tackle included!
