## **Don't Miss Out!**

Make sure you complete the following on or before the deadlines listed below; failure to do so will forfeit your spot in these programs. All Environmental Stewards programs have alternate assignments.

### **Reservation and Fee**

- Complete the YEA! Media Release/Waiver form and pay \$40 to reserve your spot; this covers two in-school programs and an off-campus field trip!
- Fees may be paid in cash or online through the school website. Cash or proof of online payment must be submitted at the same time as YEA! paperwork.
- **Note:** the last day for online payment is 9/12/2019; last day for cash payment is 9/13/2019.

**Permission Slip/Medical Form** for off-campus field trip will be distributed separately.

AICE Environmental Management classes from South Plantation High School will be taking part in several hands-on, place-based educational experiences this school year – both on campus and through field trips to off-campus locations.

All programs tie directly to the curriculum, provide engaging ways to learn key content, and help students become better environmental stewards. School-based programs will be delivered on campus during normal instructional time; off campus field trips will typically span an entire school day.

Fall programs will be delivered by the Youth Environmental Alliance (YEA!). These include two school-based hands-on experiences (described on this sheet) and one off-site field trip (described on reverse).
